

Selection Criteria – ECEI Coordinator Allied Health/Educator

Essential:

1. Tertiary qualifications in Early Childhood, Primary Teaching or Allied Health Professional (Occupational Therapist, Psychologist, Physiotherapist, Social Worker, Speech Pathologist or Developmental Educator) with relevant professional body registration or eligibility for membership
2. Sound knowledge of conducting child development assessments
3. Sound knowledge of planning and facilitating group and individual interventions for children with disability or developmental delay
4. Excellent written and oral communication, interpersonal and negotiation skills, with the ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships
5. Well-developed organisational, time management, administrative skills and computer literacy with the ability to plan, prioritise and meet deadlines
6. Working knowledge of regional mainstream and community supports and services for children
7. Demonstrated awareness of the National Disability Insurance Scheme, the ECEI approach and commitment to early childhood intervention best practice principals

Desirable:

1. Lived experience of the impact of existing or acquired disability upon individuals, carers and community
2. Experience with or understanding of Culturally and Linguistically Diverse communities and/or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities
